- \* Member and Chairman of the Montana State University Foundation, 1992-94; honorary member of Chi Epsilon, 1981; and a true MSU Bobcat at heart.
- \* Expanded Morrison-Maierle's engineering expertise throughout the world as he led project management work for USAID in Vietnam, Zaire, Mauritania, Tanzania, Lesotho, Egypt, and the Philippines where he designed roads, highways, and other transportation infrastructure projects.
- \* Devoted countless hours to civic organizations such as the Montana World Trade Center, Helena Chamber of Commerce, Helena YMCA, Helena Optimist Club, and the Masonic Order.
- \* A true engineer and keen problem-solver; he is an exemplary model of the values Morrison-Maierle holds true to this day: integrity, commitment, respect and excellence.
